Teamsters action signals end of northern Michigan nursing strike

Officials at Northern Michigan Hospital say the Teamsters' withdrawal of challenges related to a union representation election signals the end of a nearly 4-year-old **<u>strike</u>** by **<u>nurses</u>**.

"The Teamsters are no longer the representative of the <u>*nurses*</u> at the Northern Michigan Hospital," Barbara Allen, a spokeswoman for the hospital, told the <u>*Petoskey*</u> News-Review for a Friday story.

Teamsters Local 406 attorney Ted Iorio said the union encountered obstacles arranging a hearing on its complaint before the National Labor Relations Board. The Teamsters decided it would be quicker to withdraw the objections and allow *nurses* who favor union representation to petition for a new election, he said.

"To say that the *strike* is over, that's pure fantasy on their part," he told the Traverse City Record-Eagle. "They don't decide whether the *strike* is over or not."

Hospital officials stopped recognizing the union as the <u>nurses</u>' bargaining agent in December 2004, saying they had received a petition signed by a majority of <u>nurses</u> who said they no longer wanted to be union members. The Teamsters had contested the way the signatures were collected.

The <u>**Petoskey</u>** hospital hired temporary replacements after about half of its 470 <u>**nurses**</u> walked out on Nov. 14, 2002. Allen said more than half the <u>**strikers**</u> have since returned to work.</u>

The union has said it's the nation's longest strike by nurses.
